MEETING 28 FEBRUARY

The February meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 28th in the village hall. It was attended by the clerk, 7 parish councillors and 3 members of the public.

Public Participation:

Following concerns raised by parishioners about the felling of trees and hedgerow on Waterham Farm at the last meeting, the landowner Guy Botting attended to explain that the work done was essential in order to clear blocked and silted up drainage ditches and prevent flooding. Councillors asked him a few questions and the chairman thanked him for coming to the meeting.

Police Surgery:

Gary Morris held a surgery on 11th February in the village hall. At least one parishioner attended. He reported theft of a number plate from Staplestreet and of a vehicle from farmland. Gary will hold another surgery on 24th March 2pm Village Hall.

The Neighbourhood Plan:

A public presentation of the results of the recent survey and next steps will be made in the village hall on 14th March 6-6.45pm.

Highstreet Road. Erection of single storey side extension. Councillors voted by majority to support the application.

Crockham Farmhouse, Crockham Lane. Submission of plans to discharge conditions placed on approval of adjacent new building. Application Permitted.

Decision 22/500436

Drainage plan for land north of High Street Road. Application Permitted.

Decision 23/505788

Conservation area notification: felling of Silver Birch Tree, 2 Redbrick Cottages Plum Pudding Lane. No objections.

Litter Pick

The village litter pick took place on 17th February in conjunction with the church and DCA. Hi-vis jackets, gloves and bags were supplied and refreshments served in the village hall. 18 people took part and managed to collect over 40 large bags of rubbish and several tyres. Rebecca has since been in contact with Swale BC to request more or bigger bins and more frequent collections from Wey Street slip road- a notorious litter hot spot. Councillors hope to organise further litter picks perhaps quarterly.

Highways Improvement Plan (HIP)

The long awaited speed limit signs will be erected by KCC on 22nd April. The reason for the delay is that road closures will be necessary. The council have a number of banners, posters and stickers to be distributed via a stall at the village fete.

The Kent Speed watch team will be coming to the next PC meeting in March to explain how to set up a group here. Please could anyone interested in taking part come along and find out what may be involved, the

by 20th July 2024. The temporary mandatory 50mph and 40mph speed restrictions will be imposed in both directions as follows:-

1. Whenever there is only a single running lane.
2. Through the contraflow section, from approximately 1200 metres to the west side of the Hernhill crossover point to approximately 1200 metres from the east side of the Chestfield tunnel crossover point, and to the extent indicated by signage on site.

It may also be necessary to implement lane 2 closures in both directions between the hours of 05.00 and 19.00 from 5th April 2024 until 13th April 2024 and also between the hours of 05.00 and 19.00 from 13th July 2024 until 20th July 2024 to maintain a safe environment for passing traffic. It will also be necessary to prohibit the following traffic movements:-

The A299 Thanet Way, Hernhill, Yorkletts, Whitstable, Chestfield and Herne Bay will be closed west bound (London bound) only between the hours of 19.00 and 05.00, from 5th April 2024 until 12th April 2024 and 13th July 2024 until 20th July 2024, when the appropriate signage is displayed on site.

THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

TEMPORARY ORDER APRIL 2024

To install, maintain as required and remove a contra-flow traffic management system and to enable major carriageway reconstruction works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit traffic movements and restrict speeds on the A299 Thanet Way, Hernhill, Yorkletts, Whitstable, Chestfield & Herne Bay.

The restrictions are planned from 5th April 2024, with estimated completion by 20th July 2024, or where stated on a valid Permit. The scheduled dates may vary for these works with appropriate signage displayed on site and the works will be displayed on [One.Network](#)

Temporary mandatory 50mph and 40 mph speed restrictions will be imposed at all times on the A299 Thanet Way, Hernhill, Yorkletts, Whitstable, Chestfield and Herne Bay, from 5th April 2024, with an estimated completion

following traffic movements:-

The A299 Thanet Way, Hernhill, Yorkletts, Whitstable, Chestfield and Herne Bay may be closed in both directions at any time between the 5th April 2024 and 20th July 2024, and when the appropriate signage is displayed on site. This restriction is required as a contingency for any incident responses, vehicle recovery and maintenance to the traffic management equipment.

The alternative route for diverted traffic is as follows:-

A2 Boughton bypass, A2 Harbledown off/on slip eastbound/westbound, A2050 Harbledown bypass, Rheims Way, A290 Rheims Way, A28 Pin Hill, Rhodaus Town, Upper Bridge Street, Lower Bridge Street, Broad Street, Military Road, Tourtel Road,

Sturry Road, Mill Road, A291 Sturry Hill, Herne Bay Road, Calcott Hill, Canterbury Road, Herne Street, A299 Thanet Way and vice versa.

The restrictions are required for the safety of the public and workforce while installation, maintenance, removal of a contra-flow traffic management system and major carriageway reconstruction works are undertaken by Kent County Council.

Following on the theme of the piece I wrote last month, at Swale Borough Council its all systems go in preparation for the new waste collection contract which is coming in late March.

I was hoping to have included information about which days resident's bins would now be emptied on a parish by parish basis, but a few additional, last minute changes to the routes meant that sadly this was not possible. I can, however, say that letters are being sent out to every household from mid-February, so you should have received one by the time you read this.

The new collection dates will take effect from Monday 25th March, so please stick to your current collection dates until that point.

As I also mentioned last month, we will be doing our best to improve rates of collection

not only of dry recycling, but also of food waste. This is something that has numerous benefits, including helping to keep your bins less smelly and your green bin cleaner and reducing the cost of disposing of waste for our councils. The food waste collected separately from household rubbish is turned into compost, which is great for the environment. 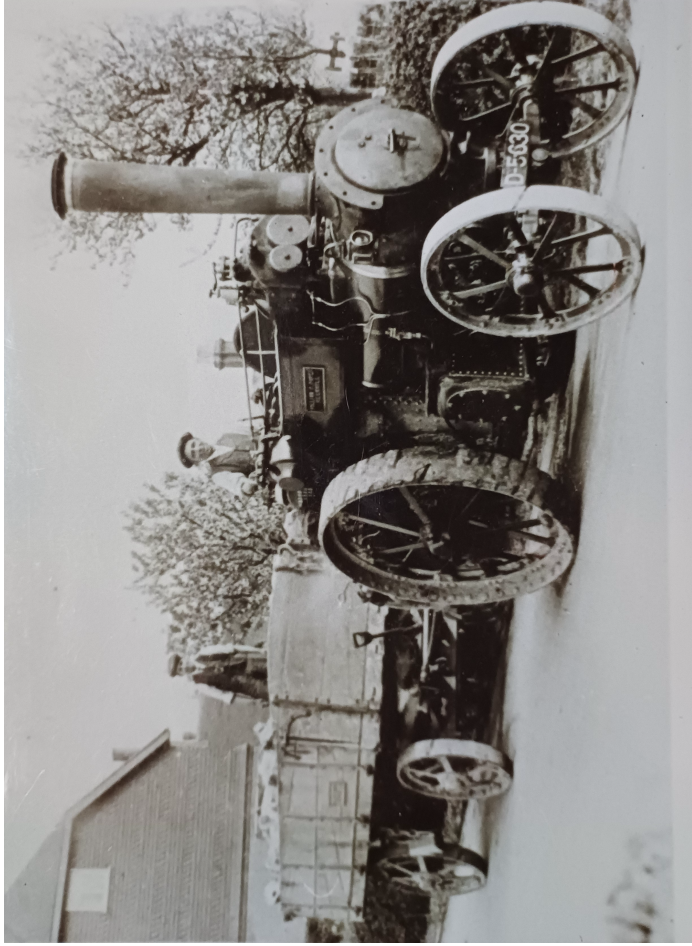

Fred Bones with the Mount Ephraim engine outside No 4, Staplestreet, in 1910. His eldest son, Fred Junior, is the lad in the trailer. It was an Aveling and Porter GKN Tractor, built in Strood, works number 7137, and could be converted into a roller when needed. The engine was kept in a shed at Holly Hill Farm, which was still standing when Tom Boorman copied the photograph for the old Hernhill Historical Society in 1988. It was sold to Faversham Haulage firm Francis Davies in 1918.
